



## Innovation Project Spotlight - Eagle Nest Presentation Guide

Reminder - The top 12 teams will be the only ones presenting to a panel of Judges (Eagles Nest Presentation style), but you can use this guide to also prepare for the open public, college students, and VIPS conversations (they will be voting on their top 5).

Introduction (1 min):	<ul> <li>Team Introduction: Team Name, Number, Where you are from</li> <li>Project Overview: Provide a concise overview of your project, including the problem you identified and the innovative solution your team developed.</li> </ul>
Research (1 min):	<ul> <li>Problem Definition: Clearly articulate the problem you identified. Use data and real-world examples to support your understanding.</li> <li>Research Depth: Showcase the depth of your research. Highlight interviews, surveys, or other methods used to gather information.</li> </ul>
Innovation (1 min):	<ul> <li>Innovative Solution: Present your innovative solution with clarity. Explain how it addresses the identified problem effectively.</li> <li>Creativity and Originality: Emphasize the unique aspects of your solution. Highlight any creative or original elements that set your project apart.</li> </ul>
Implementation (1 min):	<ul> <li>Feasibility: Discuss the feasibility of your solution. Address potential challenges and how your team plans to overcome them.</li> <li>Impact: Explain the potential impact of your solution on the community or target audience. Showcase any testing or prototyping you've done.</li> </ul>
Conclusion (1 min):	<ul> <li>Summary: Summarize the key points of your presentation. Reiterate the problem, solution, and impact concisely.</li> <li>Closing Statement: End with a strong closing statement that leaves a lasting impression on the judges. (SELL IT!!!)</li> </ul>
Reminders:	<ul> <li>Presentation Skills:         <ul> <li>Communication: Demonstrate effective communication skills.</li> <li>Speak clearly, maintain eye contact, and ensure that each team member has a chance to contribute.</li> <li>Engagement: Keep the audience engaged through visuals, demonstrations, or interactive elements.
